ROW IN A LONDON CHURCH.

Troubles Between a Congregation and Its Pastor.

LONDON, Oct. 8.—The trouble in the F. I. Congregational church has become more and more serious. Rev. R. N. Nisbet has been requested by his deacons to abstain from preaching until matters are straightened out. Since his arrival, he has been charged with 150 shillings and other charges, having one of the parsonage of Rev. G. Trotter. This action was caused by the refusal of Nisbet to produce any credentials or proper qualifications.

Various religious papers have denounced Rev. Nisbet as a clerical impostor, and that was the name the pastor gave himself in his resignation. The difference between "R. Nisbet" and "Rev. Nisbet" is what has caused the deacons to doubt that he is not a clerical impostor. Opponents of Mr. Nisbet stated that he is simply an unknown wanderer and has been ejected from the Congregational, Baptist, Wesleyan and other churches. They had been outraged and strangled. They were found by villagers. The two girls were lying side by side, their clothes both drenched with blood. They had a school book on the table, their fingers protruded and eyes rolled up and a dark circle on each neck, showing that strangulation had occurred. An inquest is now going on.
