Pauncefote Instrument Lapse When New Agreement May be Signed.

London, Feb. 9.—It has been learned Wednesday, 27th, February. that a reply will shortly be sent to the be tantamount to such a refusal. It will consist, mainly, in a counter-

proposal te proposals, likely to necessitate extended negotiations. The nature of the proposal is not yet ascertainable. Lord Pauncefote will probably be the medium through which the answer will be sent. The subsequent negotiations will chiefly be conducted through him. In Pritish official opinion it is likely that several months will elapse before the matter reaches a conclusion. which time the Hay-Pannecfote treaty will have lapsed. On the basis of the senate's amendments and the British counter-proposals now formulating, it is hoped an entirely new agreement, satisfactory to both countries, will eventual ly be reached.


