Salisbury, just returned from France, which he believed had resulted from foothold. of the empire had dissipated the noamples of the past. The empire was undoubtedly safer, and the cause of peace more secure. There was now no power in the world but knew that, if defied the might of Great Britain, it would defy one of the most formidable enemies that could possibly be

encountered. Another benefit that war had revealed was the existence for a long time of a conspiracy to oust British from South Africa, which, it had not been encountered now. would have strengthened and grown more dangerous. The British had been thereby taught a lesson regarding home rule for Ireland. When they had fought in the past against Irish home rule they had not realized what sort of a fight could be maintained by a hostile government against its suzerain, no matter how overwhelming the power of the suzerain. If the home rule bill of 1893 had been passed and Irish government established at Dublin, it was not very extravagant to assume, in view of the exhibitions in the house of commons and elsewhere. that it would have been a hostile
