


What are the arguments necessary to sell your goods? You may sit in your office and theorize all day, and not come as near the truth as you could get in half an hour by going down where the sales are made and finding out exactly what they are.

I often wonder if any impression is made on the public mind by one form of advertising which has been used so much it seems it must be worn out : "This line 49c., worth \$1.35;" "this line 89c., worth \$2.50." Do people believe that sort of thing? If they don't what is the use of printing it.

Would it not be better to give such a careful and attractive description of the article offered as would make people wonder when you quoted your regular prices how could you afford to sell it so cheap? Women are the greatest readers of
