

THE LATE JOHN REDMOND.

Lansdowne, May 24.-John Red mond, an old and greatly respected resident of Lansdowne, was suddenly called to his reward, on Thursday, 23rd inst., death being the result of a kick in the head from his horse on the evening of the 21st. He was ren-

dered insensible at once and never He was one of the pioneers of this district, and was in his eighty-first year when he met his untimely end. He was born in the township of Escott, on the 12th of March. 1821, son of James Redmond, one of the first settlers. His early life was spent on the farm—then mostly bush—but being of a studious turn of mind, he took advantage of the meagre educational facilities of the day and qualified himself for a public school teacher. He followed his profession a few vears in his younger days, but most of his life was spent in business purswits. He opened a general store in the village of Escott in the early fiities; carried it on about two years. when he removed to Caintown, where he remained for some years. where he carried on a successful trade for upwards of thirty years, retiring nine years ago to spend his remaining days in the quiet enjoyment of a snug and well-earned competence. 
