Twenty-one Feet Deep-It Las Cost \$10,000,000 Already-Canadian Shippers Slow.

Toronto, July 24 .- 'The improveengineer of that great undertaking, engineer of the Canadian canal, on an inspection of the St. Lawrence river and Trent valley canals. Mr. Ripley says the American canal at the Soo has cost \$10,000,000 up to the present time. The plans for its improvement will give it a three feet greater depth than the Canadian, which is classed as eighteen feet.

Secretary Russell, of the Canadian manufactuers' association, has received a letter from J. H. Moore, manuliacturers' agent, of London, Eng. which states that the Americans are making big inroads in the old country, and suggests that Canada should "wake up." In England there is a big demand for Canadian products, but Canadians seem very slow to take advantage of it. "I wish you would make it known in some way ormous amount of goods that are imported into England from other countries," writes Mr. Moore.
