

Nearly 300 Christians Killed in

The Korean Islands. Washington, Aug. 13 .- The state department has received delayed mail advices concerning the rayelt in the island of Quelport, near Corea, some time ago. The advices show that about 300 persons were killed, mostly christians.

The state department gives a summary of advices received from minister Allen, our representative in Corea,

which says in part: 'According to advices received at the expartment of state up to July 3rd, the revolt on the island of Quelport, off the southern coast of Corea, has been suppressed by the Corean government, aided by two French gunboats. About 300 persons were killed in the revolt, mostly christians.
