Keeping an Aquarium. A friend who has had an aquarium for many years sends this as embodying his

experience with it: In setting up an aquarium each fish. requires one gallon of water. Put two inches or so of thoroughly washed gravel on the bottom of the tank (one corner with clean washed sand). Do not filter water; use city or pond water. Put in the gravel some "water plants" (a small bunch to every two or three gallons of water) and one or-two stones. 
