The Porcelain Tower. The famous percelain tower was one of fondly. the architectural boasts of Nanking, China. It was reared in the ninth century | ma?" before Christ by King A-yon and has been twice rebuilt-once in the fourth century of the Christian era and again in 1413 by Hoang-la Tai. The tower originary Collier's Weekly. inally attained a height of 350 feet. It consisted of nine stories surmounted by a great mast bounded by a spiral cage and crowned by an immense globe. A hundred and fifty-two large bells were hung from the roofs of the nine stories, which were ornamented also with 128 lamps. The cost of the original edifice was estimated at between \$35,000,000 and \$40,000,000. It was made of white brick, and the walls and roofs were brilliantly ornamented with porcelain. The great porcelain tower was destroyed in 1853, during
