London, June 13.-The correspondent I the Daily Express at Machadodorp sends, by way of Lorenzo Marques, Boer versions of the recent fighting in the Orange River colony, as the British now call what was formerly the Orange Free State, which resulted in disaster to a battalion of the Derbyshire regiment. Dating this despatch June 10th the correspondent states that president Kruger issued a bulletin reporting that the burghers on the 7th advanced in four divisions under commandants Steenkamp, Froneman, Duploy, Fourio and Nel, and attacked the British at Roodeval and Rhenoster river. Severe fighting ensued, which lasted for hours. Two hundred British were killed wounded and 700 were captured, to gether with immense stores, including food and ammunition.
