

RIO DE JANEIRO, Jan. 13 -A great sensation has been caused by the publication of the police report on the conspiracy to assassinate president Braes on Nov. 5th last. Several attempts miscarried before the one of November. The report concludes with indicting twenty persons, including vice president Victorino Pereira, Capt. Lopez Cruz, of the Brazilian navy, seven majors and colonels, senator Cordeiro, eight deputies and the soldier Marcellino, who was executed for the crime. 
