SKETCH OF ITS HISTORY FORTY TWO YEARS AGO.

Continuation of Prize Essay Written by Young Lawyer in 1856-The Old Lime. stone Oity Has Changed Somewhat Since Then - Earlier Fortifications also mentions what has been above stated,

Herewith is given a continuation of an osean on Kingston, written in 1856 by C. W. Cooper. The first instalment appeared last Monday : -

"At the time of the conquest of Canada Fort Frontenac was the general rendezvous of all the northern and western Indian naclone; the centre of trade, not only with the French, but also among themselves. 
