'Under the inhuman policy of Weyler, not less than 400,000 self-supporting, ample, peaceable, defenseless country people were driven from their homes in the agricultural portions of the Spanish on the barren waste outside the residence portion of the cities and within the lines of intrenchment established a little way beyond.
