PASSING OF THE BUDGET. CITY COUNCIL DEALS WITH THE YEARLY FINANCIAL SUPPLIES.

Only Two Changes Made In The Finance Committee. Preparation Parks Committee Get A Extra Four Hundred Dollars - Rate of Taxation Eighteen and One-half Mills on the Dollar.

At the regular meeting of the city council last evening Ald. McKelvey presented the budget prepared by the finance committee. In a clear introductory address he reviewed, statistically, the high expenditure on streets last year, which although he had been careful, especially along the line of opening up streets.

The council went into committee of the whole, and considered the budget clause by clause, the chief doing the reading. No alterations in the budget were made until the controller's expenditure list was reached.

With reference to the allowance for printing Ald. Behan signified his intention of keeping the printing account down to a minimum figure this year.

Ald. Curtis took strong exception to the reduction in the allowance for parks, made by the finance committee. He had heard the committee had treated the parks committee with actual contempt.

Ald. Wright asked if Frontenac park was to have a band stand.

Ald. Curtis replied that the ground would be levelled, seats would be provided, a fence planted and a band stand built if there was any money to spare.

Ald. Elliott explained that the finance committee cut down the appropriation on the statement of ex-chairman Allen, who had said that he left the parks in first-class order.

Ald. Ryan thought there were other works of greater necessity than beautifying parks. When the debentures were sold, it would be ready to pay for the parks.

Ald. Behan wanted the citizens to distinctly understand that the vote of the people regarding bonuses was the cause of the increase in the rate of taxation.

Ald. Behan moved, seconded by Ald. Donnelly, that \$50 be allowed for the purchase of two new flags for the city buildings.
