The Great Question Is: "What Will Mckinley Do?"

HE FEARS WAR FOR HUMANITY'S SAKE.

The President Has Grown More Thoughtful And Grave-The Shock Of Seeing For The First Time & West Indian Pilot -Passing Through & Troublous And Sorrowful Season-Butchered His Wife And Children And Then Committed Saicide-Dreadful Orimes Perpetrated

(Special Correspondence, Letter No. 1690.)

New York, April 1.-The week just passed has been one of the most oppressive that New York has seen for years. There has been a sense of impending calamity pervading the atmosphere, telling of danger to come. Go where you will -in the hotels, the drinking saloons, the workshops and the churches, you hear nothing but war. Men meet in the streets and the first question is, "What is McKinley going to do?" The next is, "Did the Spanish government connive at the destruction of the Maine! Senator Thurston's speech last week was like dropping a bomb in a barrel of dyn imite and the discovery of Lieut. Jenkins' letter to his mother, written on the day of the Maine's destruction, telling her that he had discovered a mine beneath the ship and had reported it at headquarters, is a story too horrible for belief. The pilots who bring vessels into the ports of the West India Islands and along the coast of South America, through Chili and Peru, receive their instructions in the case of national vessels, where to berth them, the anchorage being indicated by large and conspicuously marked buoys. Foreign war ships generally are located in a part of the harbor by themselves, away from the mercantile marine, which holds on the water about the same relationship to other ships that an ordinary mechanic or laborer would hold to a millionaire on land.

His honesty purpose has never been questioned. He has firmness beyond most men-a quality which has saved him from deadly peril from many a disastrous conflict. At this point he realizes as he never did before the truth of the ancient adage, that "while speech is silver silence is golden." Since his occupancy of the White house the president has grown more thoughtful and grave-qualities greatly becoming his

Whatever may be the final outcome of this dreadful business, it is sure to leave behind an entailment of bitterness and hate that all great Neptune's ocean can never wash away. The dark waters of Lethe which lose themselves in the dread ocean of forgetfulness have borne on its silent waves no more dead-

y and sorrowful freight. Learned causists may decide that the lives so suddenly hurled from time to eternity on that soft spring night, "were due to the dispensation of God," and so in prayerful faith await an answer which

may never reach them here; but the mourners who sit by the fireless hearths of our land, whose dead ashes are the only symbol of their sorrowful despair, cry out for vengeance on the murderers of their loved ones, whose remains lie puried in the bright blue waters of Antilles queen.

No arbitrament for them; but the terrible red right hand—the reasoning of self-appointed judges and the philbsophy of untold thousands of years are idols dashed to millions of atoms-and again man stands forth in all his native savagery crying: "Blood for blood," "an eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth.

As we look over the history of recorded time, thank God we find no precedent for the destruction of the Maine and in God's providence let us hope that it will have no parallel till that tremendous day when the dread archangel, with one foot upon the sea and the other on the land, shall proclaim to the assembled nations of the earth

that "Time shall be no more." We are passing through a troublous and sorrowful season, which may possibly only be a period of preparation for a higher and a better life; let us may be, and which it is beyond our hope so, and wait with patience and faith for the outcome, whatever that power to control. One terrible feature of our daily evolution is the dreadful crimes which are matters of hourly record and from which humanity shrinks

CONCESSION TO JAPAN.

The Same Rights as Enjoyed By Britisl Vessels Over Deserting Seamen.

OTTAWA, April 2 -The department of trade and commerce has been advised by the imperial government that section 238 the British shipping act will in future apply to Japan. This means that merchant ships of Japan will be afforded the same facilities for dealing with deserted seamen in British ports as are now accorded to British vessels. Thomas Moffatt, acting agent for the de-

partment of commerce at Grahamstown, South Africa, writes to the department stating that in December, 1898, and January, 1899, there is to be an exhibition there at which Canada ought to be represented. The public accounts committee held its first meeting resterday. The auditorgeneral asked for the appointment of a small sub-committee to go into the differences between himself and the different departments and treasury board on the sub-

ject of the audit of accounts. A discussion ensued during which the auditorgeneral pointed out that while in his office the government had only allowed three increases of salary this year, in the finance department seven had been allowed. It was finally decided to leave the appointment of the sub-committee over.


