WASHINGTON, April 20. -The cabinet adjourned a few moments after five o'clock yesterday. It was stated that the ultimatum to Spain is not yet ready for signa. ture. Both the ultimatum and the Cuban resolutions will be signed this morning The president insists on giving Spain at least three days to decide whether she will evacuate Cuba or fight.

It was stated at the war department yes. terday that only the national guard will be given opportunity to volunteer at this time. The president will reserve the right to ap point all staff and field officers, while the governors of states will designate regimental officers as was done in 1861.

The cabinet meeting, it was learned, during the afternoon practically decided to supplement the regular army in their operations in Cuba by calling for 80,000 men of the national militia. Secretary Alger at once held a conference with Gen. Miles and adjutant-general Corbin to arrange details.




