



NEW YORK, April 30 -A Key West special to the World says : Admiral Sampsin is obeying the blockading orders with energy and sorrow. He feels, however, that the administration will soon see the futility of the p'an which starves our allies before it touches the enemy, and will not allow him to act. Despatches from Eastport, Me, state

that over thirty five reports of cannon shots were heard off Queddy Head, and it is supposed that the Minneapolis, which left Princetown, Mass., yesterday, bound north, encountered a Spanish war vessel and an engagement is going on. A despatch from St. John's, Nfl., says : The captain of the British steamer Wans-

beck, in to day from Cadiz, says Spaniards were preparing a fleet to sail for United States ports and shell coast cities. When off the Azores a week ago the steamer Havre, of the North German Lloyde, passed the Spanish fleet, the flagship of which demanded her nationality. The fleet was pointing northward at a ten knot rate, hoping to pick up United States

merchantmen. The Spanish fleet, which sailed from Cape Verde on Taureday, is bound for the North American coast.


