To give Will readers some idea of the manufacture of charcoal on a large and scientific ecale it may be mentioned that seventeen large charcoal kilns are now erected here and will soon be in active operation, as in former days. Each kiln is of brick and resembles in shape an enormous old-fashioned, conical bee-hive They are about sixty feet each in diameter and nearly the same height. At the top is a large cast-iron door through which the kilns are filled with cord wood. Each on has a capacity of about forty-five cords o wood at one time, and each cord should average about forty bushels of charcoal. 
