The Plan Of Campaign.

Tampa, Fla., May 3.-I understand that the plan of campaign is for the first expedition to sail this week and seize a port, probably Matanzas, or some other town on the north coast of Cuba, suitable for a base for distributing arms and amunition to the rebels, and relief to the starving Cuban families. Once the base has been firmly established the rebels will be instructed f to endeaver to drive the Spanish westward, forcing a concentration of the great bulk of the Spanish troops in the direction of Havana, where they will be attacked by the main body of United States army later, probably in the autumn.

Eleven regiments of infantry, one of cavalry and ten light batteries of artillery are now concentrated at Tampa, making a force of about 7,000 men. A the troops recently ordered here from Mobile. New Orleans and Chickamauga have now arrived. It is generally believed in Tampa that this force will be augmented in the near future by at least two regiments of cavalry from Chickamauga besides the artillery.




