

WHEN IT'S DIG OR DIE

WHY THE SOLDIER OF TODAY MUST FIGHT IN A TRENCH.

The Unpleasant Vigor of the Modern Rifle Bullet, Which Pierces Steel or Oak, but Is Stopped by Earth, Makes Intrenchment Necessary.

The shovel plays an important part in the warfare of today. Intelligently used it may win a battle or save a city. The modern rifle bullet, sped by high power explosives and having vigor enough to bore through two feet of oak after a mile of flight, demands an antidote. The commander who needlessly exposes a line of men to such a fire is a heartless butcher. Nothing will stop such missiles quicker and surer than earth. That is where the shovel comes in.

The lesson is not a new one, but its application will be somewhat novel. We learned to fight behind intrenchments dur-


Of course to stop and dig a ditch is not so heroic as to lie down with your trusty rifle in hand in face of the enemy, but it is a heap safer.

The simplest form of shelter for a coldier in open country is a shallow trench, which will furnish from the excavation sufficient earth, when heaped upon the side toward the enemy, to screen the soldier from view and to protect him from bullets. This is commonly known as a rifle pit or shelter trench. Its length depends upon the number of
