HE THREATENS TO RESIGN.

ALD. ELLIOTT OFFENDED AT COUNCIL'S RULING.

Says He Will Resign From The Board Of Health On Account Of The Council Not Supporting A Recommendation From The Board—A New Drain, Badly Needed On Gore Street.

At last night's meeting of the city council Ald. Carson presented the report of the board of works, recommending no action at present on the request of the stage drivers, and that the city commissioner be instructed to withdraw the charge against W. Hobbs.
