FASHIONS OF NEW YORK.

Ready Made Costumes For the Outdoor Girl.
DUCKS AND CRASHES IN THE LEAD

Some Newer and Finer Fabrics For the Woman Who is Content to Sit Still and Look Pretty—Odd Fancies in Millinery, Neckwear and Parasols.

However much we may pity the unfortunate women who toil for a pittance, we cannot help feeling glad of the fact that we can purchase our garments ready made, and made prettily and stylishly, for really less than it would cost us to buy the materials and hire them made.

In saying these things I do not include the gowns, wraps or bonnets made at the small private establishments where prices are exorbitant. I mean those offered in the large department stores.

The latest fashions put forward in these places just now is the tennis girls' supplies. The dresses are pretty and dainty yet easy and strong. Among these the favorite colors are white and navy blue. The white is of basket duck, linen crash and Bedford wools. These wools gowns are sometimes shown where the wools form a sort of bayonet effect. The waists are woven from half an inch to an inch apart and are so thick that they show up in high relief.

A tennis suit of white basket duck had a polka blouse, open at the throat to show a gathered vest of white linen. Around the bottom there was a band of striped percale, cardinal and white, so that the

strips run up and down. The sleeves had cuffs of the percale, and the rovers and cuffs were lined with it. The whole effect is neat and pretty.

Blouses were completed to make another tennis suit. Around the bottom were three rows of white tape. The blouse was unusually pretty. The sleeves were bishop shape, with cuffs of white linen, with two rows of black braid. The sailor collar was trimmed with several rows of narrow soutache. There were a stock, full vest and a sailor's tie of cardinal straw. A black straw sailor hat with a wide white ribbon completed the costume. Tall boaters made of duck and crash are much liked for tennis.

Plugs, both white and colored, is very good and useful for tennis and other active outdoor requirements, that produced in tan being especially good. It wears well and washes well. Skirts to wear with white shirt waists and short ruffled jackets are very dressy. They are trimmed with white or brown braid and pearl buttons. Sometimes they have an arrangement of both white and brown braid. Others again have overlays of lace insertion between the braid.

Mohair is one of the favorite stuffs for everyday outdoor wear. It is produced in all the light colors of the season and in black, white and cream. A new idea is shown in the making of this always pretty fabric, and that is to have a whole lot of bias ruffles around the bottom, one overlapping the other. There are some mohairs with an iridescent effect, not very pronounced, but still clearly discernible. It depends largely upon the development of the goods how handsome a gown may be achieved.

One handsome costume was made of mohair where drab and green were mingled with white. The skirt had two deep sprung flounces put on in tunic shape, being nearly twice as deep in the back as in the front. Each ruffle of flounce was edged with velvet ribbon to match and lined with the same. The bodice was in surplus form, with a ruffle of cream lace edged with velvet ribbon. There was a cape to match, which was very stylish and worthy of being copied in almost any kind of reasonable goods. It was short and not very full. A sprung ruffle five inches wide of the mohair was sewed around the edge and carried up in a jabot to the throat. Just above the ruffle was a wide band of cream colored lace insertion, with a row of the velvet ribbon at each edge. Another ruffle and a row of insertion were put up around the neck. There was a tunic collar with a wide ruffling of silk mull, which was looped down the front by the side of the jabot.

The materials oftentimes seen now in skirts and also on some of the new parasols I saw also a stock made of corse silk covered with this, and in front there was an enormous bow with long ends made of the same, the ends being edged with a binding of corse velvet.

ALL CANADA IS WITH US.

Statement of a Canadian Delegation to the Conference in Baltimore.
BALTIMORE, May 9.—Bishop Wilton called to-day's session of the conference of the Methodist Episcopal church to order. Congressman J. P. D. Liver, Iowa, sent a request to the conference that the reception of fraternal delegates from the Methodist Episcopal church, of which he is ecc. be postponed for a week. It was decided to receive the fraternal delegates from England and Canada on May 11th, and those from the Methodist Episcopal church on May 15th. No other business was transacted.

An interesting statement was made by the Rev. W. S. Griffin, fraternal delegate for the Methodist church of Canada. He said: "We are on the side of the United States. We believe there is no hope for Cuba, the Philippine Islands or any other and when Spain might have until the Anglo-Saxon race gains control. The Spaniards are bullfighters and barbarians; they will remain so and keep civilization from ever reaching them. The universal feeling of sympathy for the United States in Canada is remarkable. Even the country press and the people of small towns are expressing the same feeling. I am unanimous and hearty. I wish to be particularly emphatic in making this statement."

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
