

Action-The Air Supply Cut Off, the Men in the Intense Heat Wilt Right and Left -They Know Not How the Battle Goes-The Least Accident Might Result in Death to Them.

Very little is known by the public of the general conditions that prevail underneath the decks of modern men-of-war, and how trying are the duties of the gallant engineers and stokers, on whose efforts depend the success of the ship. It is reported that commedere Dewey steamed his ship at the rate of eight knots an hour during the fight. Even at this elow rate of speed the suffering among the men in the engine and boiler rooms must have been intense. When the ships entered the bay of Manilla every hatch and port hole in the fleet was closed tight as wax. Heavy armor plate gratings cover the hatches, the ventilators were closed and every air and water compartment was hermetically sealed. The men below decks were not expected to be heard from again until the fight was over. Their position was anything but pleasant. The instant the erdinary drafts that supply the boilers were shub off, forced draft was made by means of the big blowers which forced air down under the boilers. These fans, revolving at the rate of 600 revolutions per minute and supplying 1,000 feet of air per minute, make a deafening noise. The stokers, stripped of all clothes except a breech-cloth, and shoes to pre vent their feet from burning, shovel coal continuously. They only stop when ccm. pletely exhausted.

The temperature of the rooms, which approaches that of a bake even, causes the men to wilt right and left, and as soon as one faints be is carried to a place where ALL OTHERS ARE MITATIONS the conditions are not so severe. Coal dust fills the air, and together with the stifling heat makes it almost impossible Tutti Frutti. Send be, in stames to: to breathe. The deafening roar and whirl of the blowers, together with the continuous pumping of the engines and the rattle of coal, makes communication by means of speech impossible. Orders are transmitted by signals, told off on the fingers. Above the endless din, however, the boom of the guns on deck can be plainly heard, and the stagger of the ship which follows each discharge is also felt. Every moment there is danger of some accident to the boilers, which would cause the death of every man in the engine room. The broaking of an exhaust pipo or a steam pipe, if not corrected instantly, would lead death every engineer and stoker below decks.
