In the summer of 1856 there was an outbreak of yellow fever, and the inhabitants of Castleton organized into a mob and armed with sticks, stones, guns and torches, attacked a quarantine building, which they set on fire and destroyed, despite the resistance of the local authorities and calls for soldiers from other states. The state authorities began to erect new quarantine buildings, but these in turn were burned by another mob of violent Staten Islanders, all efforts to placate whom failed utterly. Recruits even were sent to aid the Staten Islanders from New Jersey. The hostility to the establishment of a quarantine increased in strength. The Castleton board of health declared it a nuisance, and on the night of Sept. 1, 1856.
