



DANGEROUS ACT.

The Power in the Hands of the Medical Men is Too Powerful.

Windsor Record. The legislature has conferred on the medical council extraordinary powers powers which in tyrannical and unscrupulous hands might be wielded gratify personal and selfish ends. The act provides that when any registered medical practitioner is found to have been "guilty of any infamous or disgraceful conduct in a professional respect" he is liable to have his name erased from the register. In an ordinary court the prosecutor is one person and the judge is another, but in the administration of justice by t medical council the anomaly is presented of prosecutor, judge and executioner in one. An alleged offense is committed against the council and that body lays the information against the accused, sits in judgment upon him and inflicts the penalty. It is contrary to the spirit of British justice and fair play that any man or corporate body shall at the same time be accuser and judge. It needs no argument to show accuser is disqualified and incapable of exercising a judicial function, and outside of the callings of law and medicine an offender is tried [a judge, who in the very nature of things is removed from the influence of selfish or other unworthy motives. The medical act would seem to be a gross violation of this principle, wh lies at the very foundation of the judicial system and is a guarantee of th purity of the administration of justice.
