




HOUSES AND POPULATION.

Mifferences Between the Number of Inhabitants of Cities and Their Dwellings. The ordinary way of figuring the size of a city is by computing the number of inhabitants it contains. Still another way is to give the area it covers and a third is to calculate the number of houses which contains. Park Commissioner Woodruff of Brooklyn, in a recent speech to the Civitas club, pointed out the fact that Brooklyn contains within its city boundaries 125,000 houses. New York city. with a population 50 per cent greater than Brooklyn's, has a total of only 115,000 buildings, of which 90,000 are devoted wholly or chiefly to dwelling purposes and 25,000 to stores, warehouses or institutions of a public character.

The number of houses in London is 600,000, extending over an area of 117 square miles. There are 90,000 houses in Paris, a much smaller number than the total in either New York or Brooklyn, though the total population of the French Lowdon, May 1.—In the house of lords the city of New York.
