MUNICIPAL LEGISLATION. Township of Kingston Council. June 1.—Council met for court of revision. Upon an appeal from G. T. R. Co. against their assessment on the grounds of overcharge and non-compliance with the assessment act, no action. This being the only case the court closed and township business was taken up. Moved by Mr. Purdy and resolved, that the reeve and first deputy examine the line between the townships of Kingston and Ernestown and meet the council of township of Ernestown with power to act. Upon motion of Mr. Purdy, seconded by Mr. George, the reeve, first and second deputy-reeves were appointed to take legal advice in the matter of taking up township property on the so-called branch of the Perth road from the Perth road toll gate westerly towards Cataract. On motion of Mr. George, W. Purdy will be allowed to pay his taxes to the treasurer for last year. Moved by Mr. Purdy, seconded by Mr. George, the reeve, first and second deputy-reeves were appointed to take legal advice in the matter of taking up township property on the so-called branch of the Perth road from the Perth road toll gate westerly towards Cataract. On motion of Mr. George, W. Purdy will be allowed to pay his taxes to the treasurer for last year. Moved by Mr. Purdy, seconded by Mr. George, the reeve, first and second deputy-reeves were appointed to take legal advice in the matter of taking up township property on the so-called branch of the Perth road from the Perth road toll gate westerly towards Cataract. On motion of Mr. George, W. Purdy will be allowed to pay his taxes to the treasurer for last year.

Palmerston and Canoto Council. The council met May 16th and accepted from W. J. Donaldson a transfer of lots, bought on behalf of the municipality at the land sale in 1893, and also the Fish Creek road. He was allowed \$24.00. Mrs. Thurston, sick widow, was voted \$5 for convalescence to hospital. The treasurer's bonds were examined and pronounced satisfactory. By-law ninety-three was completed by inserting the names of W. J. Donaldson and Isaac Allen, as path-masters to fill vacancies. Road division No. 7 was divided and a new division formed on the Snow Road under George Ennis. A grant of \$200 was made to repair the bridge across Black Creek, on Clarendon and Robertville road, the old one being carried away by a recent flood. The assessor's roll was accepted as finally revised and he was voted for receiving. Legal advice will be sought in regard to the objection of James Miller, through having two public highways through his lot in concession eleven, Palmerston. Robert Shanks was voted \$2.50 for raising a bridge across the river during the winter. On motion of Alex. Watt a resolution, fixing a legal height of the fence at four and one-half feet, was passed and authenticated as by-law. The township assessor was instructed to lay out a road for Hugh McKinnon across lot twenty-one, concession six, Palmerston. Adjourned till third Saturday in August. The court of revision met same day with John McKenzie as chairman. W. J. Donaldson's assessment was reduced from \$400 to \$300 on lot twenty, concession nine, Palmerston; no action on the appeal of Henry Morgan; James Chappell's assessment reduced from \$100 to \$75, South Canoto.

Portland Council Notes. Portland council met as a court of revision. Members all present. E. M. Huffman and Napanee River Improvement Co.'s real estate assessments confirmed. Several names were added to the roll. Regular business transacted. The taxes of E. Snider were remitted. S. Sibley petitioned to have the second concession opened; ordered to be done; the clerk to notify parties concerned. Sums voted: \$7 to John Wilkinson, on road; \$3 to P. Tallon, do; \$8 to J. E. Watson, do; fifty cents to A. Grant, do; \$3 to D. Snider, do; \$7 to J. Burnes, do; \$1.50 to J. Dixon, do; \$2 to P. Bilmor, do; \$15 to G. Bradford, cedar; \$7 to S. Martin, culvert; \$7 to G. S. Carr, job on road; \$8 to E. Ashley, job on road; \$1.25 to W. S. Percy, culverts; \$1 to J. Smith, job on road; \$4 to D. Snider, timber; \$1.50 to John Charlton, job on road; \$15 to Perry & Lovell, gravel; \$7 to J. C. Wood, work on road; \$4 to E. M. Huffman, work on road; \$3 to P. Myers, charny's salary; \$1 to Mrs. Cole, charity; \$3 to Storm's sisters, charity; \$5 to Mrs. H. McLennan, keeping Mrs. Cummy, a pauper, five weeks. A petition from residents of Hartington and Harrowmith prayed to have their statute labor commuted at the rate of forty cents per day. No action taken. Adjourned till 10 o'clock. Assessor's hall, Verona, Monday, June 22nd, at ten a.m.
