They totalled up to £172,049, an increase of 135 per cent, as compared with the exports of the corresponding period of £15,000, cheese £21,000, fish £36,000, and wood £20,000. No eggs or animals were entered during the month. The imports to Canada during January from Great Britain totalled £351,111, a decrease of 10
