RATIFICATION'S INGENIOUS SCHEME:

How He Smuggled Goods Past U. S. Customs Officers.

EW YORK, Sept. 27.—Col. E. Ratto, who pleaded his guilty in the United States District Court to a charge of smuggling fare into the United States, is, according to the government officials, one of the smartest smugglers with whom they have had to do, and is hard to deal with. Agent for J. S. Hall, he went into the business of smuggling, using his position as agent to a coasting vessel for his operations.
