HE'S A GIFTED LECTURER

DAVID CHRISTIE MURRAY WAS
HEARD WITH DELIGHT

His Conception of Poetry of the Nicest Kind—The English Language is the Fullest in the World—Sketches of Three Great Englishmen.

OUTSIDERS think Kingston has not a very favorable reputation as a literary center, but the audience at the opera house last evening was abundant evidence of the fact that a good many people in Kingston even if it be a lecture. David Christie Murray came here yesterday by the most interesting differences from Boston's journals and those who went to hear him last evening were greatly pleased. We are safe in saying that there was no disappointment.

The alma mater society of Queen's is to be congratulated on its success in bringing in such a distinguished lecturer. Mr. Murray's interest in a very few words by Principal Grant and commenced his "talk" as the lecturer calls his address, by saying that the greatest oracy in the world was that found in the lips of the lecturer.

The first half of his lecture was an entertainment with many examples given in a masterly fashion quotations from Randall and the Psalmist, from Tennyson and obscure rustic, from Burns and Harkness. He went to show the thoughts and emotions were really identical though given to the world in widely varied forms.

In other words a golden chain of human emotion comes down in unbroken continuity from the highest pitch to which genius can reach to the lowest depths of society.

The great poet addresses himself to the common emotions of us all, and, therefore, is great and only because true.

The quotations given from Tennyson and Burns were uttered with a higher than eloquent effect.

They revealed to the audience the true soul of the speaker and his mastery of poetic art.

"The form alone is eloquent," was an expression of his lecturer's opinion of the poem he had chosen.

ISLAND PARKS

The Dominion Government Proposes to Establish Them Among the Thousand Islands.

HE dominion government has decided to spend a considerable amount of money on the transformation of Gordon Island into a few miles below Gananoque, into a public park, where anyone can go and camp, without interference or cost.

A wharf will be built in the early spring and the whole island cleaned up. It is fifteen acres in extent and one of the most beautiful islands on the river. There is enough deep water for the largest river boats to land. Eight or ten of the finest resort houses, reached by boats, are to be converted into lodges, reaching from Gananoque to Brockville, to be converted into lodges.
