

but no alarm was given. When the fall came the frame buildings adjoining were crushed and covered by debris and those within had no chance to escape.

The crash aroused everyone in the block and as the rains took fire at once an alarm was turned in and ten engine companier began the work of attempted rescue. The ruius were cruelted into the basement and now lie even with the sidewalk. It is impossible to get upon the debris to

assempt the work of rescue, and the firemen are compelled to throw water on the smoking ruins, knowing that their work might be ending the life of some unfortunate lying half dead in the wreckage. In the building No. 763 was the family of John Kunze, who kept a jewelry store on the ground floor. The family consisted of the father, mother and son Frank, who was associated with his father in the store.
