

THE BUDGET FROM GERMANY

THE BILL FOR TAXING REAL PROPERTY PASSED.

The Servian Coup d'Etat Said to Have Been Hatched in Paris in the Interest of Russia—The Belgian Riots—The Troops in arms.

BERLIN, April 17.—The bill of Dr. Miguel, Prussian Finance Minister, altering the incidence of direct taxation on real property, finally passed the Lower House of the Reichstag yesterday. It will take effect in January, and it is closely linked with the Prussian Electoral Reform bill, both being the results of a compromise effected by Dr. Miguel between the Conservatives and the Centre.

Both houses of the Landtag are gratified with the proposals, which give the landlord interests advantages which were not dreamt of under the Bismarck regime.

Minor objections were put aside in order to pass the bill past before the celebration of the Reichstag's 50th anniversary.

On the line of Clay and Quintana codifies these laws, and legalizes them.
