MR. PECK GOT DAMAGES.

FOR INJURIES RECEIVED IN A RAILWAY COLLISION LAST JULY.

The Damages Sustained Resulted in a Stiffening of the Shoulder Joint--The Presence of Various Physicians--The Injuries--Dr. Sullivan Quoted--No Wound.

In the case of Peck vs. Bay of Quinte railway, tried at Brockville, a verdict of \$1,000 for damages was entered.

George Peck, of Gananoque, was injured in the railway collision near Frontville on July 21st, 1892, resulting in the partial loss of his right arm.

The shoulder joint occurred in New York he was operated upon and benefited. The evidence of Dr. Wyatt, of New York, was submitted, and the said Peck was suffering from a stiff joint, the result of a bruise.
