





At almost every turn in life men must make a choice. They are made to choose between God and satan, right and wrong. good and bad, wisdom and folly, time and eternity. The results of our choices are tremendous. Fortunes are made and lost, honor is kept stainless or ruined. and the issues of time and the hereafter are seriously involved. A fatal choice may ruin us for ever. A wise choice may forever save us. Well may we ask, then, What is my choice? Two choices are epresented in our Biblical referencesthe choice of folly and the choice of wis-

Folly considers only temporary good. It looks not to the future. It never uses reason, but only temporary greed and self interest in its choices. God calls us to do that which is right and warns us against that which is wrong, but many sire. The result is, when they do call upon the Lord, He will not hear them. "Then shall they call upon Me, and I and at the general judgment.

2. Is it the voice of wisdom? Math. vi, 19-24, "Lay not up for yourselves treasures upon earth, where moth and rust doth corrupt, and where thieves break through and steal, but lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust doth cerrupt, and where thieves do not break through and steal.' A choice founded upon these words may well be called a choice of wisdom. Wisdom differs from folly in this, while folly does not consider the future, wisdom does. Christ here urges his disciples to make the choice of wisdom-not simply to live for this world, but in our living here to consider the life beyond and to prepare for it. Many choose to live for this world rather than the world t come, for the body rather than the soul. for themselves rather than God and Christ and humanity. But let us not beamong their number. Let us make the opposite choice; for eternity is of more importance than time, the soul is of more value than the body, and the love of God in Christ is of incomparably more importance to us than any personal


