VERTICAL WRITING.

It is a compliment to the Kingston school board that, through the representations of its director of writing, the penmanship taught in our schools has been changed and modernized. The Spencerian system was very pretty to look at, and became very general in its adaptation, but it has not been easy to write, and for business correspondence and book-keeping has not been rapidly and intelligibly written. The motion of the pen has not, in connection with it, been graceful when speed has been attempted, nor has the position of the hand been natural. Hence the popularity which has followed the introduction of the vertical system. At first sight it does not seem as attractive, but it can be more quickly acquired, and for all business purposes it is more to be desired, becoming more legible and for the cords of the banks or business houses plainer, neater and compacter. Mr. Newlands, the director of writing in the public schools, saw its advantages in advance of the demand for it. and gave it his special attention. By practice he not only wrote it as beautifully, but he gathered up in connection


