NO PENSIONS FOR MEN WHO SERVE A LIFE-TIME

Sergt. Major Stand in Service for Twenty-one Years.—The Re-establishment of the Forces of Wales' Elites.—The Sergeants are standing.

In a few days Sergt.-Major Stroan, "A" battery, will have served twenty-one years in her majesty's service.
