NO PENSIONS FOR MEN WHO SERVE A LIFE-TIME

Sergeant Major Stronach in service for Twenty-one Years. The Establishment of the "Princess of Wales' Rifles"—The Riflemen are Slain.

In a few days Sergeant Major Stronach, who has served twenty-one years in the majesty's service, will be discharged from the army. He is a man of a soldier's heart, and his length of time there is a good, worthy soldier's life, and his family is dependent on his service or other work. The sergeant-major is a first-class soldier and is still in the prime of life, probably forty years of age. He explained that under the military laws of Canada there is little encouragement for a soldier. According to the system now in vogue a man can only get his country pay from early manhood till grey hairs and old age prevent further duty and then he is thrown on the mercy of the world.
