"On the face of it there would certainly appear to be grave reasons for questioning Mr. Stairs' consistency as a member of the Canadian parliament in ignoring the rejection of his bill by the house of which he is a member, and passunder the imperial statute. Of course all the facts of the case are not yet at hand, nor is it possible to yet say how far under the British statute he has roceived power that was refused him by the dominion parliament, but, not only will it be a matter of considerable interest to learn these facts, but how far the Canadian government will recognize his imperial charter and also how he will explain the course he has followed when he meets parliament next session."






