KINGSTON PRESBYTERY.
SEEKING TO MORTGAGE A MANSE
—THE CHURCH SECURITY.

Rev. Mr. Mackie had objection to mortgage God's House for a Manse. The Home Mission Report—Trending on Rev. Mr. Houston's Constitution.

G. M. Fairlie, B.A. Elders present were: Prof. Drye, James Adams, Smith Gilmore, S. Donovan and Mr. Webb.
 Rev. Mr. Houston wanted to know the reason of a clergyman being appointed to dispense the communion at Tweed, when he, Mr. Houston, was moderator of that house.

The amount expected to be raised throughout the whole church for home missions was stated to be \$9,000 for augmentation fund, \$10,000 for the current year. These sums the presbytery of Kingston is expected to contribute for home mission \$2,100, and for augmentation fund, \$1,000 for the current year. The amount expected from Kingston, presbytery is \$120.

Rev. Mr. Mackie read the report of the home mission committee. The blank forms had been forwarded to churches in mission fields, and only half of them had been received. The committee wished the official report to be deferred until next meeting. He was glad to say that the mission field in Carleton Place and Mayno, in North Hastings, was reported by Rev. G. Porteous, as promising to give \$750 per annum if the fact of an ordained minister. A grant of \$500 will be asked for that purpose. The committee felt that for the Poland district Rev. Mr. Mackie should receive an addition of \$50 to his stipend of \$700. Rev. Mr. Mackie, of the Congregational church in Orleans, N.Y., had resigned his charge, wishing to join the Presbyterian church. Mr. Mackie, senior clerk, asked privilege to mortgage for \$2,500 their new manse now under completion and valued, including lot, at \$1,300, also privilege to mortgage the church property as collateral security until such time as the debt on the manse is reduced to \$1,500, when it will carry itself. Thomas O'Brien, secretary, spoke of the petition of the church to the presbytery, and had prospered wonderfully. The church when built was located in a district where the people attended no church. A good Sunday school and christian endeavor society had been established. A ladies' aid in connection has raised \$200 or \$300 since commencing by the society which was paying for an organ which would be paid for this year and aid would be received from the ladies hereafter. The pastor's salary raised \$200 for the pastor's salary and the organ was undertaken. A certain gentleman had left a legacy of \$100 to be used as a manse for the church. The gentleman had handed the speaker \$50 a couple of days ago. The present pastor was a man of great faith.

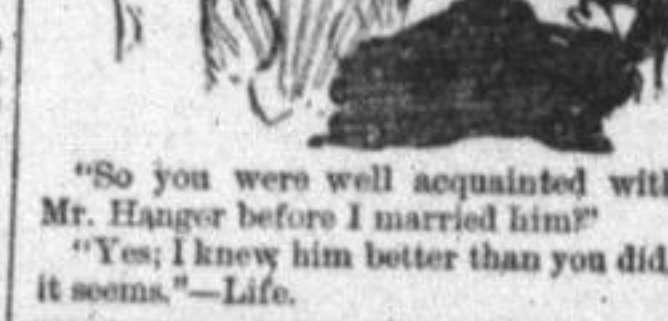
