A BATTERED GUNNER RIOT.

Sanitary Officers and Police Kicked to Death by Ignorant Villagers. RESIST HEALTH REGULATIONS. Military Called Out to Save Poles of Health from Death - Not Scattered by Glorious Bayonet Charge of the Epidemic in Europe.

HAMBOURG, Oct. 11.—Another fatal riot occurred last night in St. Pauli, a suburb of the city, growing out of the attempts of sanitary officers to enforce the regulations for the prevention of the spread of cholera. As in the previous riot when a policeman was brutally kicked and stamped upon, the scene of last night's trouble was one of the districts of the village inhabited entirely by the poor and ignorant classes, who seem to have a horror of being compelled to observe cleanliness and the ordinary sanitary regulations.

When the sanitary officers attempted to put extraordinary regulations in force trouble at once resulted. The sanitary officers were accompanied by a number of policemen, but the presence of the latter had no deterrent effect upon the violence of the mob that quickly gathered when it was known that the sanitary officials were about. The mob made a descent upon the police, stoning them and using clubs. The police were unable to quell the rioting in fact they could make no attempt to do so, being compelled to fight desperately to protect themselves from the fury of the rioters.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 11.—Brigadier-General Joseph C. Breckinridge, Inspector-General of the United States army, has made a report to the Secretary of War, indicating a condition of affairs prevailing in regard to our coast defenses which is officially characterized as "disgraceful." It is shown that almost the entire southern coast of the Atlantic seaboard is absolutely unprotected and at the mercy of a foreign foe. Forts have been allowed to crumble away, cannon have rusted and cannon carriages rotted. To quote the Inspector-General, these forts and their armaments "now serve the single purpose apparently of reminding us of the high state from which we have fallen, and that we are not well prepared for resistance against any bold and aggressive government."

Now Comes the Tug-of-War. WASHINGTON, Oct. 11.—As the eve of the test of physical endurance approaches there appears to be manifestations of uneasiness on the part of some of the administration Senators, as feeling was evinced yesterday afternoon in numerous conferences between administration and anti-administration Democrats, a number of which conferences taking place in Mr. Voorhees' room. The attitude of the Republicans is causing the Democrats some uneasiness. Whether they will go to the extent of remaining and assisting through the weary watches of the night in maintaining a quorum is a question that cannot be definitely settled.

Praying for Relief. WASHINGTON, Oct. 11.—Senator Hill yesterday presented to the Senate a large petition signed by 15,000 New York business men, a banker or broker among them, praying for the repeal of the purchase clause of the Sherman Act.

Blown to Shreds. NIAGARA FALLS, Oct. 11.—A fatal accident occurred at the tunnel at Niagara Falls, N.Y. Several Italians were at work on the tunnel, and the cause of the accident was the electrical power to the different manufacturing sites. Three of the men, named Gensio Gerosa, Angelo Morone, and Angelo Morosca, were killed. A large boiler in the middle of the tunnel, which a dynamite cartridge exploded at their feet, tearing Gerosa's body into shreds and scattering parts of it fully fifty yards.
