## CZAR OF CONEY ISLAND

Sketches in the Career of John Y. McKane.

## RULES WITH ABSOLUTE POWER.

His Ideas of Amusement and Morality. Summary with Exact Justice—The Old Story of Tripping Under the Load of Prosperity.

Coney Island is pretty well known all over the country.

So is its whirling king, John Y. McKane, who enjoys being all at the same time, chairman of police commissioners, chairman of the board of health, chairman of the town board, chairman of the board of auditors, chief of police and member of the board of trustees of common lands with the veto power.

Just now it would not be uncharitable to say that Mr. McKane's name rests under a
