The Honorable Career of a Veteran of the "Art Preservative." Horatio Hill, the oldest printer in Ch and a pioneer of Cook county, recently celebrated his eighty-fifth birthday, and surprised every one by his remarkable memory and the accuracy of detail with which all his anecdotes were related. Mr. Hill's elder brother was a congress-

ator from New Hampshire. He was also proprietor of The Patriot, a weekly publication issued in Concord. It was on this sheet that Horatio Hill's "com positorial" experience began years ago, Fourteen hours constituted a minimum day's work, and


