

THE VISTA OF PALMS. As the colt with its rider descends th slope of Olivet, the palm trees lining the road are called upon to render their contribution to the scene of welcome and rejoicfing. The branches of these trees are high oup, and some must needs climb the trees and tear off the leaves and throw them down, and others make of these leaves an emerald pavement for the coit to tread on. Long before that morning the palm tree had been typical of triumph. Herodotus and Strabo had thus described it. Layard I finds the palm leaf cut in the walls / Nineveh, with the same significance. I the Greek athletic games the victors carf ried palms. I am very glad that our Lord, who five days after had thorns upon his brow, for a little while at least had palma strewn under his feet.
