CHOSSEN BY THE PRESIDENT.

An Indiana Man Selected as Secretary of State.

Secretary of State Foster is tall, spare,

white-haired and quite distinguished looking.

His complexion is almost too fair for a man of his age, his hair is white, his skin is

yellowish gray and ordinarily rather cold, lights up pleasant glee.

John Watson Foster was born in Pike

county, Ind., March 2, 1850. He was gradu-

ated at the Indiana state university in

1873, and after one year at Harvard law

school was admitted to the bar and began

practice in Evansville. He entered the

Univ. of Indiana in 1881 as major of the Twen-

ty-third Indiana Infantry and was pro-

motioned rapidly.

During his entire service he was con-

nected with the western armies of Grant

and Sherman. He was commander of the ad-

vance brigade of cavalry in Burnside's

expedition to Fort Donelson, and was pro-

motioned rapidly.
