"Quite for Olden Days." STREETS AND TIRES. The street question, how to make and preserve the pavement, is engaging the attention of the best men of Europe and America.

Michigan has a new law which provides for a rebate of one-half of the road tax to taxpayers who use wheels with tires of a prescribed width.

The blacksmith in the Rhine county of Germany are shoeing horses with a new style of shoe, solid, so to speak, with tightly-wound tarred rope. The shoe proper is made with a groove similar to that in the periphery of a bicycle wheel into which the cushion and pneumatic tire, as fastened into the groove of the shoe a piece of the tarred rope is laid and fastened, and instead of walking on the horse walks up on the rope, which preserves his hoofs, and by clinging to pavements more effectively than hoof nails increases his hauling power.

Something better is certainly wanted on our streets than the stone macadam which is so common spread that it becomes, under the heavy traffic, dust or mud, and has to be carted away. The youngsters, too, the smallest town in Ontario, see the necessity of making permanent street improvements and so use pavement, or asphalt or brick, and find the dear work the cheap work in the end. Let us hope that Ontario will be able to make a new departure ere long in street work in the interest of enterprise and economy.
