

# AT THE TABERNACLE

DR. TALMAGE ON THE NEED OF CREASED CHRISTIAN ACTIVITY.

BROOKLYN, Oct. 2.+Since his return from Europe Dr. Talmage has faced andiences unusually large and enthusiastic, who are attracted to the Tabernacle no less by the potent eloquence of th preacher than through a desire to hear from his own lips the message of thanks intrusted to him by the Czar to the contributors of the Christian Herald famine cargo, which he and Mr. Klopsch conveyed to Russia in the steamer Leo. 


