TREATING THE CHOSTS

Chiwese Highbinders Hunne the Shades of Their Assessors. It is an odd fact that though the Chinese have been numerous in California for forcyyears or so, there is the same curiosity about their religion and rather more ignorance than at the start. The lest explanation offered is that the Chinese themselves. do not exactly know what their faith now is. They are in a transition state, and many ceremonies once religious are now merely social. This is the case eyen among

Of the expensories which once had a deep religious significance, but have recently secome the mere ritual of the tribes or orders, one of the most interesting is that of providing for ghost ancestors. As an illustration, let us take the fast celebration of the Ping Kung Toog, a powerful highbinder, society, as described in the San Francisco Chronicle, The Ping Kung Tong, says The Chronicle, took the old store at 740 Jackson street as a temple and [[fitted it up. The interior displayed all the vessels and allken draperies, as seen in the josshouses generally, At the entrance on to frighten away the evil spirits. These great images were attired in robes heavy with gold and brilliant in decoration. At the feet of one crouched a tiger and at the feet of the other a dragon. Gay fans, lanterns and paper streamers added to the

It is not easy to describe in English suited to all fatitudes the ceremonies which followed, and it is far more difficult to specify their significance. Suffice it to say that the Chinese believe that their ancestors, who are condemned to that intermediate state we call hades, are allowed once a year to leave it and wander around In search of such comfort as their earthly relatives can supply. Said relatives there-

fere feel it a duty to give them as good a time as possible. Offerings of food and drink are therefore prepared, and with them an elaborate ritual to snothe the self love of said ancestors. And here is the local reporter's account of the way they did it: "About 4 o'clock in the afternoon a procession entered the door between the huge statues. Half a dozen small boys in blue silk shoms represented prominent highbinder families. The committees from the society were grown men in long robes of blue and garnet brocaded satin. The

priest came last in a red gown bordered with gold embroidery. "Within the sanctuary the altar was piled high with cakes, fruit and vegetables. Candles and incense burned before the images. The priest pounded on a bronze gong, went through a great many motions and intened from a book, the musicians keeping time with his voice and gong prob ably as long as three hours without a pause. The children squatted on the floor behind the priest, while the committees ranged themselves on benches along the sides of the room. The outer court was crowded with Chinese, all smoking and all with their hats on, with here and there a curious white man.

"The din and powwow continued with scarcely an interval until midnight, wiser the evil spirits were supposed to be frightened off and the wandering ghosts satisfied As a conclusion to the ceremonies all the images and finery used were burned."




