



COMMERCE OF CONGO.

GREAT RESULTS EXPECTED FROM THE BASIN VERY SOON.

Completion of the First Section of the River Railroad - An Enterprise That Encountered Many Obstacles - Character of the Country Traversed by It.

A cable dispatch from the Congo aunounces that "he railroad has been completed from Matadi to Palaballa, ten miles. After the tracklayers reached that point a mile and a half of the road was completed in ten days, though nearly two years were taken to build the first ten miles. The railroad has been carried beyond the obstacles that long made rapid progress impossible, and now the great enterprise will be easily pushed forward until the upper river at Stanley Pool is connected with navigation on the lower


Mr. Stanley said once that sources of commerce on the upper river would not be worth a copper until better ! means of transportation were provided. This was a pessimistic view, for the traders of England, Belgium, Holland, and France in fact have pushed their enterprises above the cataract region of the lower river, have established stations 1,200 miles inland, have transported a dozen stenmers to Stanley Pool and thousands of porters have been carrying their merchandisc 235 miles around the cataracts. About 10,000 carriers, in the past two years,



MATADI-STARTING POINT OF THE BAILBOAD. have been engaged in this transport service. In another year or so the railroad will be completed, and then this army of porters will have to seek other employment, for the railroad will monopolize the carrying trade.

The merchants of Belgium, however, took Stanley's words to heart and a company called the Society of the Upper the Congo basin, began to study the feasibility of a railroad along the 235 miles of Congo cataracts. Their steambouts at Stanley Pool, had unimpeded navigation along 6,000 miles of the Congo and its tributaries. They desired first to learn if the trade prospects of the upper Congo region would justify the heavy cost of a railroad. So they sent an expedition four rears ago, which spent a year in threading the waterways of the Upper Congo, taking a sort of census of the people and making a thorough study of the country. . The exploring party then drew up a careful report with regard to the natives, their desire for trade, the kinds of merchandise they would buy, and the various products that could be secured for return cargoes

The company was well pleased with the report, and at once sent out two other expeditions, one to make surveys along the south bank and the other along the north bank, to decide the best route for the railroad and its probable cost. This work oc-

The engineers decided that the line, after skirting the Congo for five miles, should ascend the Leopold ravine to the plateau at Palaballa. From this point to Stanley Pool there were few engineering difficulties. It was estimated that the entire cost of the road and equipment would

The money was raised and the Congo state gave the company fainable conces sions in lands and privileges to help carry out the enterprise. Agents were sent all over Africa wherever it was thought natives could be hired as tracklayers and laborers. European carpenters, blacksmiths and other artisans were sent to the Congo to superintend departments and instruct natives to carry out various sorts of labor, At first most of the army of workmen were secured from Zenzibar, Sierra Leone, Lagos, Accra and the Kru coast of Liberia. Then Dahomey, Senegal and the Angola coasts furnished their contingent, and finally many workmen were employed from the lower Congo tribes. Last summer the force of black laborers numbered 2,500, of whom 1,500 had come from various points

The able young engineer who built it, Jean naptuste Glassener, wrote to his friends two months ago: "Next week I shall complete the bridge, and then I shall come home to " The poor fellow had overtaxed his strength and the next steamer from the Congo bore the sad news that poor Glass-ener was dead; and the friend who sent the tidings enclosed a photograph of the completed bridge to which the young man had devoted months of hard work that cost him his life. This stretch of ten miles above Matadi has for flearly two years presented the husiest seems in equatorial Africa. Fully one third of the entire work has centered in these ten miles. Now the company can make rapid progress to Stanley Pool, where they expect that traders will furnish considerable freight in the way of ivory, in a rabber, guma, dye stuffs and other acceles. It is expected also that coffee, cotton and tobacco plantations will dimately be found profitable on the pper Congo.




apitals of Europe. Who knows but some day a small part of the tourist traffic will be turned in this direction? The railroad company say they expect to provide facilities for comfortable travel, so that whoever desires may visit the once mysterious regions of inner Africa. It is likely that within the next twenty years it will be feasible to visit the great lakes without spending over two or three weeks in Africa. The merchants and missionaries among the Nyassa highlands say that when facilities for reaching Lake Nyassa are improved these mountains will be well worth the attention of tourists.

The Congo Railroad is one of the most significant features of the colossal work. which Europeans are carrying on in Africa. It is not wise, however, to take a too sanruine view of the prospect of trade in the Congo basin. Its people as yet have few wants, and these are easily supplied. The ultimate value of the region will probably depend more upon plantations of sugar, cotton, coffee and tobacco, conducted under white superintendence, than upon. any other source of commerce. In time india rubber and one or two other products may become large sources of traffic; but no hopes of permanent prosperity can be built upon the ivory trade, which is sure to dwindle in a few years. As will be seen from an examination of the illustrations, the device has much the appearance of an ordinary life raft. The screw propellers extend the entire length of the arrangement on each side of the seat of the rider and are designed to offer the least possible resistence to the motion of




