

Pople for the Week Beginning Nov. 2%. Comment by Rev. S. H. Doyle. Toppy-How to be lights in the world. kete 201, 47; Eph. v. 6-3. Speaking of himself Christ once said, "I am the light of the world." Speaking to his disciples he also said, "Ye are the light of the world." There is no contradiction in these words. Each statement is true. Christ is the original, self luminous, spiritual light. His disriples shine by reflection. He is like the

sun, self luminous. They are like the

moon, shining, yet not by inherent light,

but reflecting the sun's light.

1. "I have set thee to be a light of the Gentiles" (Acts xiii, 47). Thus spoke the Lord through Isaiah the prophet. He has put his disciples in the world that they may shine to all the people, Gentiles as well as Jews. It is the duty of Christians to shine. It is further their very nature to do so. The light must shine when placed in darkness. Put a lighted candle in a darkened room, and it must shine. Put a true Christian amid the darkness and sin of the world. and the same result necessarily follows. Hence Paul wrote to the Philippian Christians that they should be blameless and harmless in the midst of a perverse and crooked nation.' "Among whom ye shine as lights in the world." He did not say they ought to shine. He took it for granted they did shine. As it is the nature of the sun to shine to give light, heat and beauty to the physical world, so it is the nature of Christians to shine to enlighten and beautify the moral and spiritual world.

2, "Now are ye light in the Lord"

(Eph. v, 8). Paul tells the Ephesians that once they were darkness, but now are light in the Lord, or because or since they are now in fellowship with the Lord Jesus. This makes Christ the source of their light. To be lights, then if Christ is the source of all spiritual light, we must abide in him and he in us; we must have constant fellowship and communion with him. reflected upon a sin ruined world. 3. "Walk as children of light" (Eph. Walk as becometh those who are is the light of Christ. We thus walk when our conversation is Christian. What mighty power speech is for good or evil! The tongue is indeed a great light when we speak only words of kindness, peace. sympathy, love and glory and praise to the Father and the Son. We thus walk when our conduct, our lives are patterned after Christ. As children of light we must show by our conduct that we loveit, enjoy it and reflect it. Our course of conduct must prove that we hate all darkness, are not content with any ambiguous twilight, but only with the full splender of the Son of Righteonsness.
