



They have, indeed, a very complete system of their own entirely independent of the State. Their business is to carry not letters only but small parcels, packets of silver, and the like, usually to other towns in the same province, but also on occasion to other provinces, They are, in fact, general carriers.

They have no fixed tariff, varying according to weight, and there appears to be no limit, within reason, to the size of letters or parcels they will carry. The charge for letters is fairly constant, but in estimating the cost of conveyance of parcels the size and shape alone seem to be taken into account. rough calculation is then made which the sender is at liberty—if he can—to abate. 
